GETTING TO YOUR WAVE START CORRAL

- Metro will open at 6 a.m.
- Runners in waves 1-5 can access their waves between 6:20 a.m. and 7:30 a.m.
- Runners in waves 6-10 can start accessing their waves between 7:30 a.m. and 8:45 a.m.
- All runners proceed to the access control point and wave start corrals. Volunteers will guide you along.

RACE DAY ROAD RESTRICTIONS

- Long Bridge Drive
 - I-395 HOV (northbound) to Eads Street ramp
 - 14th Street, South I-395 HOV (northbound)
 - 4th Street along Jefferson Drive, SW
 - 7th & 9th Streets, SW between Independence Avenue and C Street
 - Independence Avenue, SW
 - Rock Creek Parkway, NW
 - Whitehurst Freeway, NW
 - Key Bridge (Rosslyn)
 - Army Navy Drive
- and open on a rolling basis:
Beginning at 7:30 a.m., the following roads will close Rte. 110 (all lanes) closed from 5:00 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. Spectators/runners are subject to search (no exceptions).

ACCESS TO RACE FESTIVITIES

All runners are subject to search (no exceptions).
Only registered runners (no spectators) with an official in-person ATM race bib are granted access to the start line. Bibs with word "Virtual" on them are not permitted on the ATM Race Course and/or to the ATM start line. ACCESS TO THE START LINE

Fanny packs, mobile phones, heart-rate or pace monitors, watches (to include Apple, Android, GPS or other devices), gel packs, water bottles or water belts, stand-alone hydration systems.

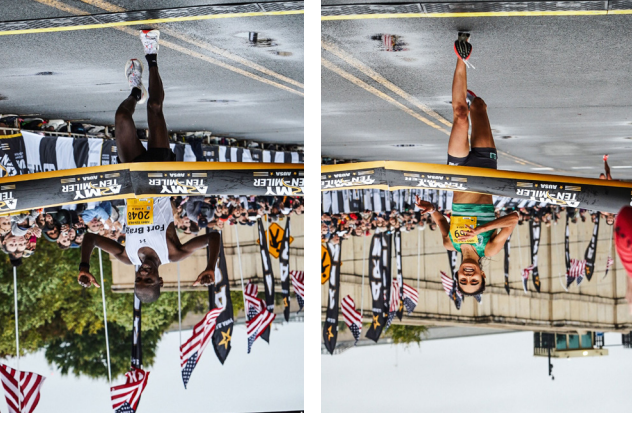
AUTHORIZED ITEMS ON THE RACE COURSE

Backpacks (of any type/size), gym bags or oversized bags; headphones or earbuds; edged weapons/flammable/combustible items, materials or devices; cutting devices; firearms of any kind; explosive/aerosol sprays (pepper or mace); strollers or baby-jogger, inline or quad roller skates, skateboards or bicycles; pets/animals (except disability or service animals); glass containers or bottles; and any vulgar or obscene flags/banners/signs or clothing/attire.

PROHIBITED ITEMS ON THE RACE COURSE

and results. All runners must maintain a 15-minute mile pace or better, complete the entire course, and finish the race in 2 hours, 30 minutes to receive an official race time and results. Slower participants will be turned at 14th Street and Independence Avenue and will not be allowed to complete the entire course. Results and awards. Bibs with word "Virtual" on them are not permitted on the ATM Race Course.

RACE POLICIES

RACE DAY POLICY
The race will take place rain or shine. No race day packet pick-up. Entry fees are non-refundable. No race day transfers to the Virtual Race.

COURSE AMENITIES AND SUPPORT
CELL PHONES allowed on course
MEDICAL SERVICES & SPOTTERS every .5 miles
LAW ENFORCEMENT & COURSE MARSHALS
MILE MARKERS & DIGITAL CLOCKS at every mile
START LINE WATER STATION
WATER STATIONS & LATRINES located at the start, finish, and approximately every two miles along the course
FIRST AID at the start, finish and along the course
ENTERTAINMENT positioned near miles 2, 4, 6 & 8
TIME LIMIT The ATM uses the IPICO system to time and score runners. It begins timing your race the instant you cross the start line. So don't worry if it takes you several minutes to reach the start – those extra minutes won't be counted toward your official race time. Runners must cross the start, 10k and finish timing mats to receive an official race time

RACE BIB POLICY Race bib swapping is not allowed. Any unregistered runner that competes with a registered runner's race bib will be disqualified. If the unregistered race bib number is associated with a team, the whole team will be disqualified from the competition. Army Ten-Miler (ATM) officials take a firm position on handing off race bib numbers due to liability issues and the adverse impact on scoring, results and awards. Bibs with word "Virtual" on them are not permitted on the ATM Race Course.

RESTRICTIONS

PENTAGON SECURITY INFORMATION

PROHIBITED ITEMS AT PENTAGON
Backpacks (of any type/size), gym bags or oversized bags; edged weapons/cutting devices; any form of firearm; any explosive/flammable/combustible items, materials or devices; aerosol sprays (pepper/mace); pets/animals (except service and assistance canines); glass containers or bottles; coolers of any size; and any vulgar or obscene flags/banners/signs or clothing/attire.

AUTHORIZED ITEMS AT PENTAGON
Mobile phones; strollers and infant bags; bicycles (must be walked); cameras or recorders (photography of Pentagon building is prohibited); service and assistance canines.

NO BACKPACKS, GYM BAGS OR OVERSIZED BAGS!

SECURITY POLICY

All runners and spectators entering any Army Ten-Miler (ATM) checkpoint are subject to search at all times. Those failing to comply will be denied access. Those refusing to leave will be turned over to Pentagon Police for escort off Pentagon property.

ATM reserves the right to implement security policies that it deems necessary to ensure the safety and security of all runners/spectators for the race. In the event of any security incident/crisis response, runners and spectators will follow instructions from first responders (law enforcement/security, fire, and ambulance).

SPECTATOR SPOTS

Cheer on the runners and be a part of the ATM experience! ATM runners appreciate the crowds of onlookers cheering them on and motivating them to give the race everything they've got! Bring your cowbells or noisemakers, carry a sign or just come out to watch along the streets throughout the course. Here are some of the best places to watch the race:

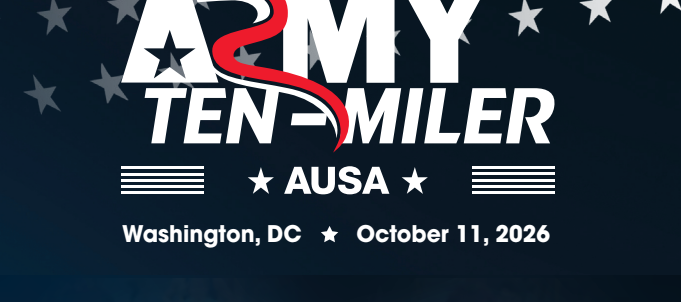
FINISH LINE/MILE 10: The number-one place to be a spectator! Watch ATM runners cross the finish line in the Pentagon North Lot. To get there, take the free event shuttle. The shuttle will run continually between Pentagon North and Pentagon South Lots from 4 a.m. – 1 p.m.

KEY BRIDGE: Runners will cross from Virginia (Rosslyn) into the District (Georgetown) by way of the Key Bridge, offering a picturesque view of the city's waterfront. Get there by taking the Blue, Orange or Silver Metro line to the Rosslyn Metro Station.

INDEPENDENCE AVENUE, SW: There are many locations along this street to get a good view of the race. Afterward, head to the National Mall or a museum to continue your DC experience!

ARMY NAVY DRIVE AND EADS STREET (BEFORE MILE 9): This is where runners know they are nearing the finish line and are finding their second wind! From there, walk over to the Pentagon South Lot and catch the free event shuttle and head to the North Lot to enjoy the post-race activities.

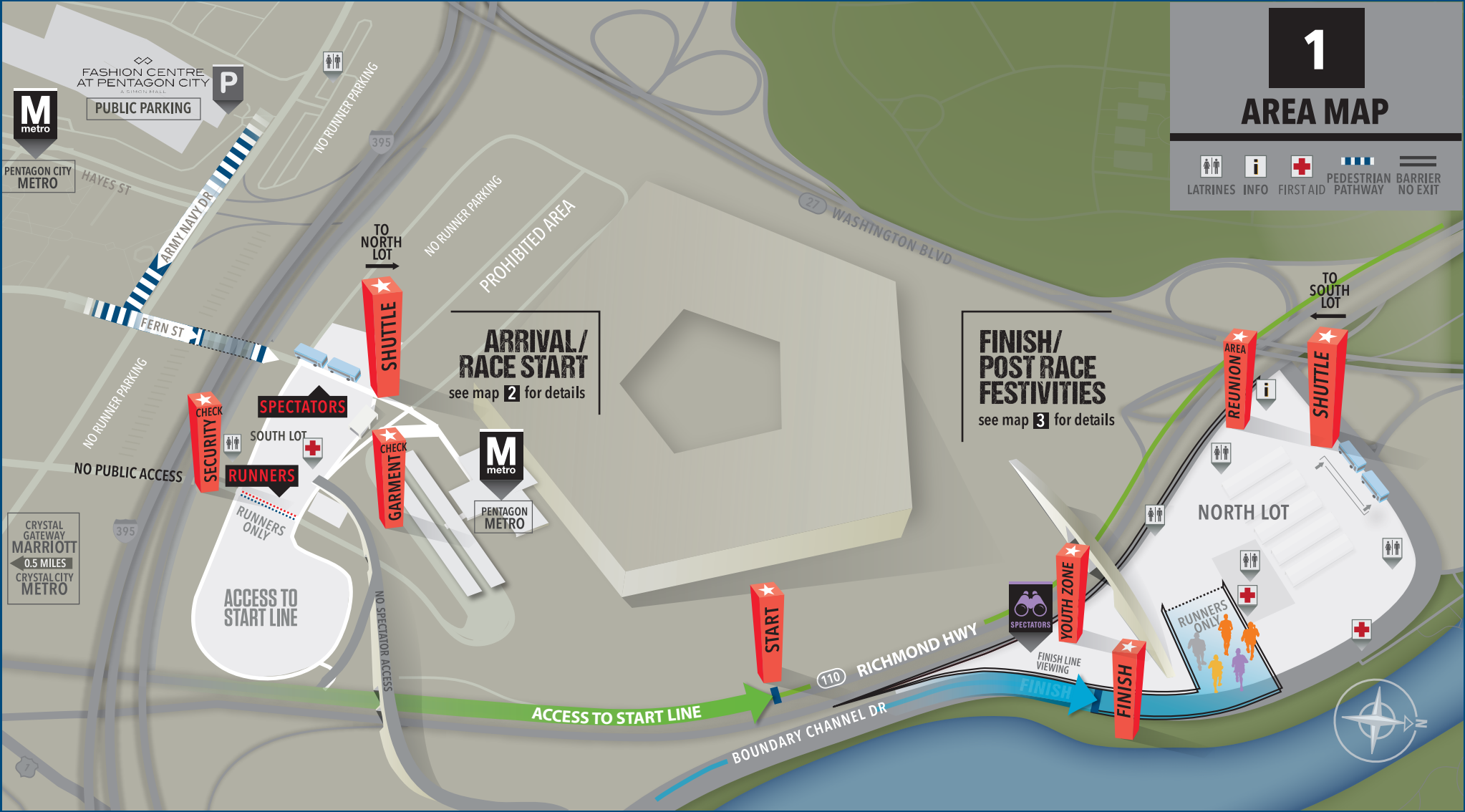

CLEMENT NEDD GARMENT CHECK

HOURS: 6 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. on race day.

LOCATION: Pentagon Metro Station, lower bus terminal.

POST RACE RETRIEVAL: Runners must return to Garment Check location to obtain their checked garments. All bags must be picked up by 12:30 p.m.

STEP 1. All items must be placed in the clear plastic bag provided. Oversized bags, backpacks and gym bags are not allowed.

STEP 2. Write your race bib number with a permanent marker on your bag.

NOTE: The ATM is not responsible for any lost, broken or stolen items. The ATM strongly recommends that you not leave mobile phones, wallets or other valuables in your garment bag.

The free event shuttle runs continually between the Pentagon North and South Lots from 4:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Strollers and wheelchairs are welcome. Runners should not take the free event shuttle to the North Lot. They will access their start line corrals through the Pentagon South Lot.

ATM HOOAH TENT ZONE PRESENTED BY OFFICIAL SPONSOR USAA

All runners who enter the Hooah Tent Zone (HTZ), must walk under the 30' USAA Archway that leads to the post-race festivities! The HTZ tradition started in the early 1990's when a few military commands arranged for tents on race day to support their teams and show their Army spirit. Since then, that tradition has grown to include over 80 tents featuring U.S. military commands, groups and installations from around the world, and of course our generous ATM Sponsors!

Free Shuttle Service to the North Lot, Pentagon.

Spectators can catch the free event shuttle by entering the Pentagon South Lot (accessible only by way of Fern Street) to reach the North Lot post-race festivities area.

Runners will visit Fort AUSA for post-race water, food and to pick up their finisher race medal. The 2026 medal celebrates the 250th anniversary of USA and highlights America's symbol of freedom and patriotism.

Return Shuttle Service to the South Lot of the Pentagon:

Participants and spectators can walk to Garment Check, Metro, and parking garages via Rte. 110 as directed by volunteers and signage or catch the free event shuttle back.

Free Shuttle Service Runs Continuously From 4 a.m. to 1 p.m.

- Please be prepared for a 10-15-minute wait during peak periods.
- Strollers and wheelchairs are welcome.
- No backpacks, gym bags, or oversized bags.
- All individuals and bags/purses subject to search.

AWARDS CEREMONY

Senior U.S. Army leadership will present awards to the best of the ATM at the Awards Stage in the Pentagon North Lot. All awards must be picked up on race day. Unfortunately, the ATM is unable to mail awards.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS CEREMONY

The individual awards ceremony will begin at 11 a.m. The awards will recognize the top three male and female competitors in various categories. All individual winners must be at the Awards Stage by 10:30 a.m.

TEAM AWARDS CEREMONY

The team awards ceremony will begin at 11:30 a.m. All team winners must be at the Awards Stage by 11 a.m.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Winners must be at the Award Stage 30 minutes prior to the awards ceremony.
- Winners must show a race bib to pick up their award.
- Age-group winners and team second- and third-place winners must pick up their awards at the Awards Tent.

RUNNER RESULTS

Individual results for the top 1,000 male and females runners will be posted by 10 a.m., with the top three teams in each division posted by 11 a.m. on the results board by the Awards Stage. YOUTH RUN

The Youth Run is a non-competitive 400m run open to children ages 4-12. It will begin at 12:00 p.m. All runners get to experience the pride of accomplishment when they cross the official ATM finish line and have a medal placed around their necks. Runner must be registered to participate in the Youth Run.

YOUTH ZONE

The Youth Zone is filled with fun, interactive activities featuring bounce houses and more! All youth must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at all times in the Youth Zone.

RUN 250 MILES FOR AMERICA CHALLENGE PRESENTED BY OFFICIAL SPONSOR GENERAL DYNAMICS

Finisher Coin Pickup Location: Runners who participated in the Challenge can pick up their coin by presenting their Challenge bib tear-off tag on their bib. The challenge coin pickup location is in the Hooah Tent Zone, next to the General Dynamics tent section "A", closest to the stage.

ARMED FORCES SERIES CHALLENGE MEDAL PICK UP POINT

Eligible runners for the Armed Forces Series Challenge (AFSC) medals can pick up their medal by presenting the Armed Forces Series Challenge sticker on their bib at the AFSC tent located near the Fort AUSA Food Tents and next to the DJ booth.

START LINE INFO + *WAVE START TIMES SUBJECT TO CHANGE

All runners must go through a security access point to get their assigned seeded area with wave start corral. Bibs with word "virtual" on them are not permitted on the ATM Race Course and/or to the ATM start line. Only registered runners wearing an official IN-PERSON ATM race bib will be allowed access to the start line. No exceptions. Runners are seeded and assigned a race wave seeding area according to their projected finish time.

A runner can move back a wave but not forward to a faster wave. Each wave start seeding area is marked with colored balloon arches. Runners will line-up behind the balloon arch that matches their bib color.
